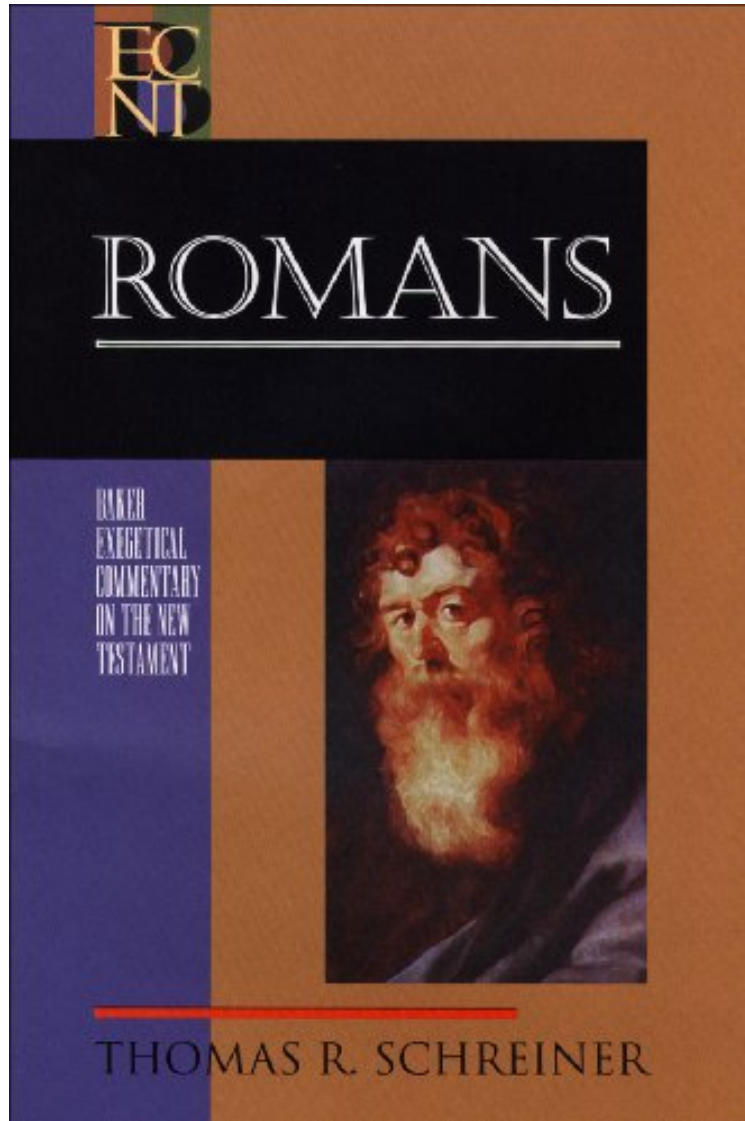

Unlike most other commentaries, one cannot simply look up individual, bold-numbered verses in order to see what one verse alone means. In order to see and understand Schreiner's arguments, one has to get into his text and find it, as

Schreiner is more concerned with Paul's flow of thought than a simply verse-by-verse exposition. Another helpful feature is found in the beginning of each section, wherein the flow of thought is laid out, thus enabling the reader to get a bird's-eye view of the lay of the land and the points Paul is trying to develop. The commentary employs a good deal of Greek, and yet all words are transliterated for those who don't know it. Theologically, Schreiner makes the case that the whole of this missionary support letter is to proclaim the supremacy of God.
