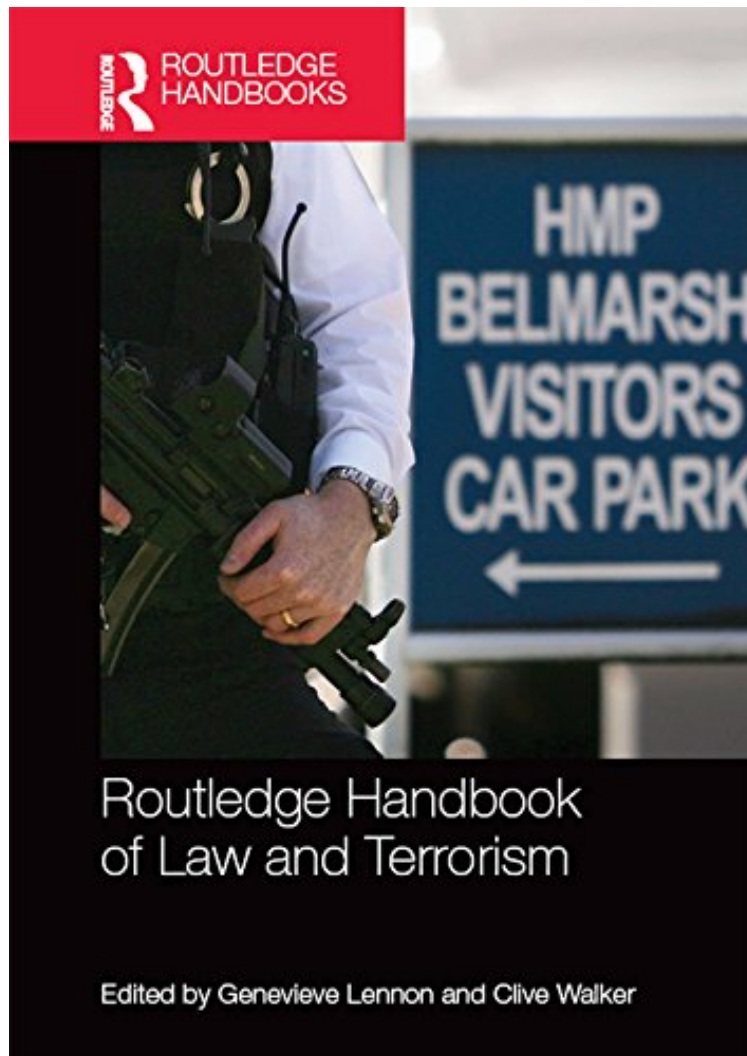

Published by Routledge, this book is an important contribution to this difficult subject, bringing together as it does, the research and analysis of no less than forty expert contributors from top universities and institutions worldwide. In the words of Lord Carlile, the book

looks at UK counter terrorism laws in the broadest context. Throughout the book, law and policy aimed at combatting terrorism is examined across a range of jurisdictions, focusing particularly on the UK, the United States, Australia, Canada and Europe. As terrorism has become a worldwide problem of worldwide concern, this comparative approach is both enlightening and useful. As the two editors, Genevieve Lennon and Clive Walker, remind us, counter-terrorism law and policy as a specialism has proliferated across the world in the years following the atrocities of 9/11.
